The conference brings together researchers at all career stages working in translation studies, transcultural studies, comparative and world literatures, health and medical humanities, environmental humanities, and the history and philosophy of knowledge to examine concepts and experiences of wellbeing, health and disease transculturally and transhistorically, as well as across ecosystems.

The conference is organised by Dr Marta Arnaldi and Prof John Ødemark, in collaboration with Oxford Comparative Criticism and Translation, and with the contribution of Pitt Rivers Museum, University of Oxford, and Medical Humanities, The Oxford Research Centre in the Humanities (TORCH), University of Oxford. It is generously funded by Bodies in Translation: Science, Knowledge and Sustainability in Cultural Translation, Department of Culture Studies and Oriental Languages, University of Oslo, and The Research Council of Norway.
